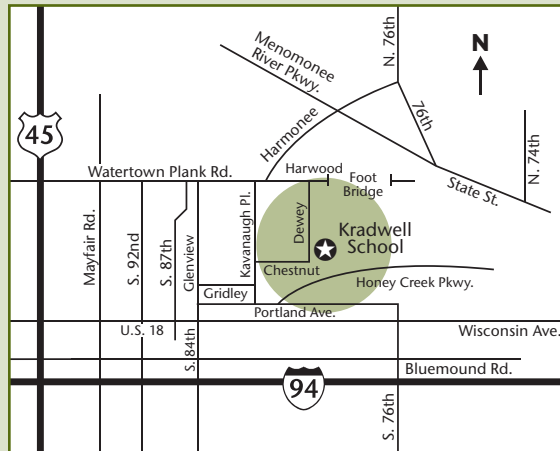




Convenient location

Why summer school at Kradwell?

Kradwell School offers the:

Kradwell School's Summer School

program is an enrichment program that provides a rewarding experience for diverse groups of students. Some come to create a firm foundation for courses they plan to take in the fall. Others come to improve reading and study skills, or to gain exposure to courses of study that aren't available at their current schools. Whatever the reasons, these students share a desire to improve academic skills, develop stronger backgrounds and gain optimism for challenges in the year or years ahead.

Summer school and overall program highlights

Kradwell School provides summer makeup, enrichment and remediation for fifth through 12th-grade students, and post-secondary students preparing for or attending college. By ensuring a safe and nurturing environment, Kradwell offers:

- A complete core curriculum and flexible scheduling in safe, educational environment
- A 5 to 1 student-to-teacher ratio
- Teachers experienced with attention deficit/attention deficit hyperactivity disorders, Asperger's syndrome, as well as learning and other behavioral disabilities
- Unique instruction programs developed for each student based on personal learning and behavioral characteristics
- Tailored instruction with books and supporting materials from multiple sources to allow flexibility when matching teaching materials to a student's needs
- Study skills integrated into individualized education programs
- Social skills addressed as a group
- Technology – classrooms equipped with computer(s) and high-speed Internet access

- Weekly progress notes available online
- Final grades mailed to referring schools
- Graduation after summer school for seniors meeting Kradwell's requirements

Courses

Kradwell School meets Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction curriculum standards. Core courses available include all levels of math, science, English (including reading and composition), social studies and social skills.

Summer school courses

The six-week summer session consists of 60-minute classes with four classes offered mornings. Flexible scheduling makes it easy for students to keep summer jobs and enjoy summer activities. Kradwell School also offers 90-minute social skills classes, including classroom instruction and practical applications.

Enrollment

Students may be enrolled in the program anytime during the school year. Enrollment is open through the first day of classes, space permitting. ***Tuition must be received by Memorial Day to guarantee enrollment.***
